

FIGURE 10.32. The Thermopolis specimen of *Archaeopteryx*—"ancient wing"—from the Jurassic Solnhofen Limestone in Bavaria, southern Germany. Dating from 150 Mya, this fossil has features that are both absent (teeth, flat sternum, long bony tail, claws on wings) and present (feathers, wings, wishbone, reduced fingers) in modern birds. This specimen had a wingspan of about 0.4 m.
