These carnivores cannibalize conspecifics more often: (*A*) a carnivore about to eat an omnivore. However, they avoid eating kin (*left bar* in *B*). After a change in diet, these carnivores reverted to the omnivorous form and lost their kin discrimination (*right bar* in *B*). The *dashed line* shows the expectation in the absence of any kin discrimination.
