FIGURE 22.8. Temporal and habitat isolation. (*A*) The ladybird beetles *Epilachna nipponica* and *Epilachna yasutomii* feed and mate on thistles and blue cohosh, respectively. *E. nipponica* is shown here on its host plant. This kind of isolation is common in insects with specialized host preferences. (*B*) *Photinus* fireflies display at different times of day, thus contributing to reproductive isolation. Seasonal isolation, in which mating occurs at different times of year, is also common.
